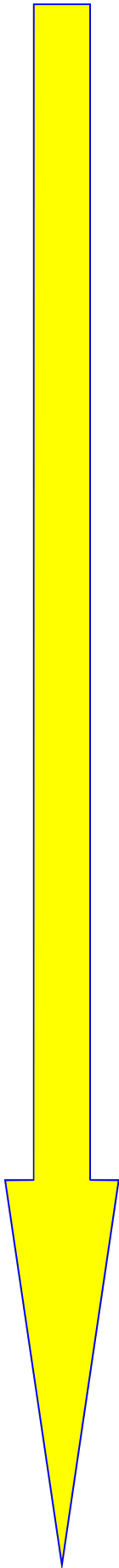
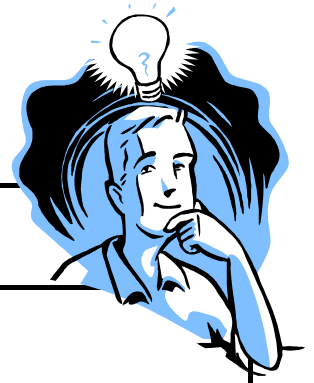


# Better judgements



## Typical features at each stage

- Simple statement
- Simple vague opinion e.g. 'its good'
- No evidence.

- A simple point of view.
- backed up with one piece of simplistic evidence.

- Simplistic judgement or point of view.
- Some evidence
- Beginning to use technical terms.

- Simplistic judgements.
- More than one piece of evidence simply explained.
- Some correct terminology.

- Judgement with evidence, including specific quotation or data.
- Explained.
- Giving at least one piece of evidence for both sides of the argument and own view.

## *Steps inbetween*

- Several balanced pieces of evidence for both sides, with specific detail and appropriate terminology.
- Personal, substantiated judgement
- The appropriate use of comparative and tentative language.
- Well structured
